INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT OLIVES

- The olive is a fruit, not a vegetable. They can be green, purple, dark brown, black and even pink in color.
- The olive tree originates from the coast of the Mediterranean Sea and western Asia.
- Olive trees can reach 26 to 49 feet tall. The crown is well branched and rounded in shape.
- The olive tree is an evergreen and can live up to 2,000 years. Today, there are more than 800 million olive trees planted worldwide.
- The average life of an olive tree is between 300 and 600 years.
- One of the oldest olive trees in the world is on the island of Crete. The tree is about 4,000 years old and is still producing fruit.
- Olives must be processed to remove the bitter glucoside oleuropein before they are edible, so they are usually first treated with lye and then pickled.
- The largest type of olive is called a "donkey olive." The smallest is known as a "bullet."
- Olives are a rich source of oils, minerals and vitamins A, E, K and B.
- The olive branch is a symbol of peace.
- Spain is the world's largest producer of olive oil. Italy is the second.
