COVID-19 & The Park All Day Program Fact Sheet

Plymouth Parks and Recreation is taking steps to keep children and staff safe this summer by following the guidelines listed below. We will keep you updated on guidelines as we receive more information from the Governor, CDC and MDH as we move through the summer months. COMMUNICATION:

- Stay home if you are sick
- Students may wear masks but it is not required (must provide your own)
- Parents must have completed the COVID-19 waiver (printed on your receipt)
- Self-monitor for symptoms (children and parents) prior to arrival:
 - New onset or worsening cough
 - Shortness of breath
 - 100.4 or higher temperature, chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell

DROP-OFF/PICK-UP PROCEDURES:

- Temporal checks will be completed each morning at check-in
- For the safety of students and staff, anyone not passing the screening (100.4 F) will not be allowed into the building and will be asked to return home
 - If an ill student has a sibling, the sibling will also be sent home for observation.
- Drop off (between 8-8:30 AM) and pick-up (between 4-4:30 pm) will be done outside of the facility
 - For drop-off/pick-up outside of these times please call the site phone
- Staff will escort students inside- parents will have very limited access to buildings
- Children who get sick with the virus may return to the program under the following conditions:
 - At least 14 days after symptoms first began, AND Improvement in respiratory symptoms (cough, shortness of breath), AND after being fever free for at least three days without the use of medication.

PROCEDURES DURING THE PROGRAM:

- Masks will be provided by the City for the staff- they will be required to wear them at all times while indoors and when in close contact with other staff/children outdoors.
- We will do our best to maintain social distancing guidance of a 3-foot radius around each student, resulting in a 6-foot total distance between any two students
- No use of playground equipment per CDC guidelines
- Bathrooms will be thoroughly disinfected each morning
- We will wash hands frequently and when kids come in contact with each other or staff for at least 20 seconds with soap and water
 - Alcohol based sanitizers with at least 60% alcohol can be used if soap and water are not available
- We will wipe down toys and equipment after use
- General arts/craft supplies (scissors, glue, etc.) will be packaged individually for each participant
- We will wipe down tables, chairs and other areas of use throughout the day
- Individual sealable cubbies will be assigned for belongings
- No offsite field trips
- Activities will limit physical contact
- Bring your own water bottle- we will not have access to drinking fountains
- Participants are encouraged to come to the program with sunscreen already applied
