

## Tax Levy History 2012-2021




Includes operating, debt, and special levies Does not include HRA levy

Average Tax Rate from 2012 - 2021 = 27.28%















## Residential Property (\$425,000) Tax Distribution 2021








## Commercial Property (\$1,000,000) Tax Distribution 2021








# Market Value % by Class 2021 Payable in 2022



# Tax Capacity % by Class 2021 Payable in 2022













## Total Taxable Market Value As Percentage of Total County Market Value








## Number of New Single Family Residential Units 2007 - 2020



















#### Net Tax Base Lost to Fiscal Disparities








#### Metro Fiscal Disparities Program - Top 6 Winners and Losers in 2021








#### Gross Business Sales by City



## Statutory Debt Limit Versus Actual Debt




#### **City of Plymouth Levies for Tax Supported Debt**








#### **Tax Capacity Rate**



#### City portion only





## Debt Service as % of Operating Expenses City portion only





### Direct Net Debt as % of Market Value City portion only





#### City of Plymouth Employees Per 1,000 Population








Employees Per 1,000 Population

#### 2020-21 Tax Levy Increases (%)





#### **2021 Levy Per Capita Comparison**


