

PLYMOUTH COMMUNITY CENTER CONSTRUCTION UPDATE



The Plymouth Community Center closed at the end of August to start Phase 2 construction, which includes renovation of the existing building. Phase 1 is expected to be completed in early December when the new Active Wing will open. The Active Wing includes the indoor playground, year-round walking track, fitness studios, and gymnasium.
