

Fazendin Park Enhancement

Why Enhance Fazendin?

- Increase plant diversity and tree cover
- Attract pollinators, birds, and small mammals to the park
- Decrease use of herbicides and pesticides
- Make Fazendin more environmentally friendly



Fruit Orchard

- Behind 2440, 2430, 2420 Holly Ln N and 2445 Garland Ln N
- Sidewalk for perimeter on west and South edge
- Tree line for perimeter on east and North edge

- Attract pollinators
- Add something different to the park







- Signs with names of fruit
- Mulch paths
- Mow between paths
- Mow perimeter near sidewalk and property lines
- Tree guards and other rodent protection

- Behind 17010, 16940, 16930 24th Ave N



Why?

- Increase pollinator populations
- Important to food system
- Attract pollinators to the fruit orchard section
- Native plants




- 33 butterfly/moth species and 5 bee species are on Minnesota's list of, "Species with Greatest Conservation Need"
- Monarch populations have declined by 80% since the 1995
- Bumblebee populations have been declining since 2006
- Causes for pollinator decline include flowerless landscapes, lack of crop and forest diversity, pesticide use, and disease



Maintenance

- Mow perimeter near sidewalk and private property
- Mow once every spring and burn every 4 years
- Spot treatment of invasive weeds
- Bluebird houses
- Pollinator shelters



Evergreen

- Behind 2435, 2425
Garland Ln N



Why?

- Green all year
- Year-round air filtration
- Winter shelter for birds and mammals
- Fruit shrubs provide food for birds and mammals



- Install bird houses




Nut/Seed Trees


